NOTICE TO PERSONS WHO MAY HAVE SUFFERED FROM INADEQUATE ACCESSIBLE FEATURES AT THE TAPESTRY

On April 29, 2025, the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York entered a consent decree resolving a lawsuit brought by the United States Department of Justice against East 124th Street, LLC alleging a failure to include certain accessible features for persons with disabilities required by the Fair Housing Act, 42 U.S.C. § 3604(1)(3)(c), in the design and construction of The Tapestry.

Under this consent decree, a person may be entitled to receive monetary relief if they:

- WERE DISCOURAGED FROM LIVING AT THIS PROPERTY BECAUSE OF THE LACK OF ACCESSIBLE FEATURES.
- HAVE BEEN HURT IN ANY WAY BY THE LACK OF ACCESSIBLE FEATURES AT THIS PROPERTY.
- PAID TO HAVE AN APARTMENT AT THIS PROPERTY MADE MORE ACCESSIBLE TO PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES, OR
- WERE OTHERWISE DISCRIMINATED AGAINST ON THE BASIS OF DISABILITY AT THIS PROPERTY.
